Please find below the summary of our week in school.		
English	This week, we introduced our new book, 'Claude in the City.' The children have visualised and responded to a text to help them make predictions. All drew their visualisation of what they think Claude looks like after hearing the description. They have used their knowledge of the characters to explore what they might say. Also, the children predicted which adventure Claude would go on. They have written a dialogue between characters using speech bubbles. Next week, we will continue with Claude in the City.	
Maths	We have started a new topic, 'Multiplication and division.' This week, the children have been counting in 2s, 5s, and 10s. They recognised equal groups, added equal groups, and made arrays. Next week, we will continue learning multiplication and division.	
Science	We have started with our new theme, 'plants'? The children wrote down what they already knew about plants and what they wanted to find out. Next week, we will continue learning about plants.
